

CITY OF SIMPSONVILLE
REGULAR CITY MEETING MINUTES
CITY COMMISSION ROOM
June 15, 2021
7:00 PM

Present: Mayor Vowels, Commissioners Emmons, Hesse and McDowell, City Attorney Hays as legal counsel, Board Attorney Brammell, City Administrator Eden, City Clerk Miller.

Absent: Commissioner Garland.

Mayor Vowels called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Pledge

Mayor Vowels presented, for approval, the minutes from June 7, 2021 city meeting. After review, **Commissioner McDowell made the motion to accept minutes as presented. Commissioner Emmons seconded. Motion carried unanimously.**

Mayor Vowels recognized the Commissioner's Report:

Commissioner McDowell (Road) – No Report

Commissioner Hesse (Sewer) – No Report

Commissioner Garland (Police/Parks) – Absent

Commissioner Emmons (Finance) –

Commissioner Emmons presented the May Financial Reports. No discussion. **Commissioner McDowell made the motion to accept as presented. Commissioner Hesse seconded. Motion carried unanimously.**

Mayor Vowels' Report:

Mayor Vowels shared the following: His concern regarding the City's camera system and the need to update and asked City Administrator Eden to research, for consideration, a comprehensive plan to integrate current with new or to replace the entire system; As a reminder, due to the Sunday, July 4 holiday recognized by the City Monday, July 5, the first meeting in July will be Tuesday, July 6, 2021.

Mayor Vowels recognized the City Attorney's Report:

City Attorney Hays shared the application process between Linda Ain, Franchise Attorney, and Finley Engineering is being finalized and may be ready to present at a July city meeting.

Mayor Vowels recognized the Board Attorney's Report:

Board Attorney Brammell shared that Brammell Law Office will continue to represent the City of Simpsonville, however, Attorney Chelsey Brammell, beginning July 2021, will be attending the City's meetings.

Mayor Vowels recognized the City Clerk's Report:

City Clerk Miller shared the City has two delinquent property taxes for 2020 totaling \$444.86. These two properties already have liens filed due to delinquent 2018 and 2019 taxes. Total delinquent is \$1,445.54.

Mayor Vowels recognized the City Administrator:

City Administrator Eden presented to the Commission, for approval, an encroachment permit requested by Finley Engineering. **Commissioner Hesse made the motion to approve the encroachment permit requested by Finley Engineering pending award of franchise and confirming KYTC standards are followed. Commissioner Emmons seconded. Motion carried unanimously.**

City Administrator Eden presented to the Commission, for approval, the execution of the agreement with ATC Group Service for \$3,200.00 to complete the Hazardous Mitigation Survey for the new location of the police department. **Commissioner Hesse made the motion to approve the agreement with ATC Group Service for \$3,200.00 for the execution of the Hazardous Mitigation Survey. Commissioner McDowell seconded. Motion carried unanimously.**

City Administrator Eden also shared the following: The City is awaiting Corpus Christi School's response regarding the 2021/2022 lease; KLC Conference scheduled for September and now open for registration, contact City Clerk Miller if interested in attending; City of Shelbyville plans to surplus their bucket truck at their Thursday meeting and should be available for purchase; Rolling Ridge HOA inquiring about "no thru" traffic signage. Confirmed with City Attorneys roads are public right-of-way and unable to deny usage of roadway.

Mayor Vowels called for a closed session to discuss a litigation matter for the City of Simpsonville. Based on KRS 61.810(1)(c), discussions of proposed or pending litigation against or on behalf of the public agency is to be in closed session. **Commissioner McDowell made the motion to enter in to closed session. Commissioner Hesse seconded. Motion carried unanimously.**

Commissioner Hesse made the motion to enter back from closed session. Commissioner McDowell seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Vowels shared he had discussion with Shelby County Judge Ison regarding usage of the 7101 Shelbyville Road property recently purchased by the City and that on behalf of the City of Simpsonville, from approval given at the June 7 city meeting, the county would be given three months for a decision.

Commissioner McDowell made the motion to adjourn. Commissioner Hesse seconded. Motion carried unanimously. The meeting adjourned 7:39 pm.
